My Vision of my exhibition is to represent the artworks that were inspired by cultural artists such as Frida Kahlo and Rene Magritte. Each artwork tells a story that connects to the theme of nature, beauty, and religion. My artworks are about a first-generation Hispanic teenage girl who struggles to find self true love within herself. From a young age, she deals with a lot of pain, and sometimes I portray this type of feeling with the inspiration Of Frida Kahlo artworks. Although it is hard to explain my feelings alone, I use symbolism where. I let the viewer make their prediction about the artwork. Similar to the way Rene Magritte does is various artworks.
